Jason Collingwood — Four-end Block Weaves and Shaft Switching for 4-shaft loom

Madelyn van der Hoogt—Things That Go Bump, Deflected Weaves, 4 - 8 shafts

Flesburg Bound Weave System on Only 3 Shafts!!

Historic Flesburg textiles had been analyzed to determine the technique used for a number of unique designs on only 3 shafts.
